

FALMOUTH - Arthur L. Blaquiere 92 a resident of Falmouth died July 23 at Falmouth Hospital after a brief illness. He was the husband of Mildred Cassidy Blaquiere and Clare Palmer Blaquiere who died in 1976. Born and raised in Orient Heihts Mr. Blaquiere was a resident of Falmouth and previously lived in Everett and Brighton. A master cabinetmaker by trade Mr. Blaquiere retired in 1973 from his position as the head of maintenance for the John E. Cain Co. in Cambridge. He was formerly employed by the East Boston Narrow Gauge Railroad as a pilot on their Boston to East Boston ferries.

During World War II Mr. Blaquiere served in the Army as a technical sergeant in Central Europe and in the United States. He was awarded the American Service Medal the Good Conduct Medal and the European-African-Middle Eastern Service Medal. While living in Brighton he was a parishioner of St. Columbkille's Parish and active in the Holy Name Society. In later years in Everett he was a parishioner of St. Therese's Parish where he was a member of the 1000 Club.

Surviving are two sons Arthur L. Blaquiere Jr. of Hawaii and Joseph F. Blaquiere of Falmouth - two stepsons David DeOme of Texas and Ronald DeOme of Randolph - a stepdaughter Carol Gursky of Saugus - and grandchildren.

He was also the stepfather of the late Linda DeOme. A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 11 a.m. Aug. 31 at St. Patrick's Church 511 Main St. Falmouth. Burial will follow in the Massachusetts National Cemetery Bourne.
